POSITION OF PROSECUTION

The case now hangs entirely upon the nature of the instructions of the court, so far as further proceedings are concerned. The prosecution admits that there has been no corroborative evidence connecting the defendant directly with the killing of Steuenberg.

OPINION OF JUDGE WOOD

In his instructions in the Haywood case, Judge Wood said: "It makes no difference in this case what crimes have been committed in Colorado, in the Cour d'Alenes or elsewhere, or who is responsible for the commission of such crimes, if any there be, the defendant cannot be convicted unless the state has established beyond a reasonable doubt that he is guilty of the crime charged in the indictment, to wit, the killing of Frank Steuenberg."
