MANY DEMOCRATIC CANDIDATES

Maloney Seems to Be Only One Out for Mayor, However.

While the democratic city central committee at its meeting yesterday afternoon in the office of Chairman J. J. Hughes did not, it was stated, transact any business, owing to the absence of several of the members, the names of a number of possible candidates for mayor were 'informally' mentioned.

Indications are that Councilman Maloney will meet with no opposition for the democratic nomination for mayor, at least up to date no other candidate has been mentioned. S. L. Einyre, it is anticipated, will have a clear field for renomination for city solicitor.

In the First ward, C. E. Walters and E. J. Quirk have already filed affidavits that they are candidates for the party nomination. In the Second ward, up to date, no aspirant for democratic honors has announced.

Legal Department of State Trying to Interpret Biennial Election Law Recently Enacted by Legislature.

DES MOINES, Jan. 13.—(Special).—When the supreme court meets Tuesday the most important case to be submitted to it will involve a constitutional question.

In addition to this case, the court at this sitting will have more than the usual number of cases that have attracted general attention. There will be argued a petition for rehearing in the case of Ben V. Sallinger against the Western Union Telegraph company.

It is quite likely, too, that the case involving the indeterminate sentence law from Woodbury county may also be argued this week.

COOK BERATES LAND OFFICE

Insists it is Engaged in Persecuting Citizens of the State of Colorado.

SAYS NOTHING IN LAND FRAUDS

Congressman Praises Judge Lewis for Quashing Indictments and Denouncing Land Officials and President.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 12.—In a personal letter, which he has addressed to the president and vice president, Speaker Cannon and all members of congress, the justices of the supreme court, members of the president's cabinet and the Washington newspaper correspondents, Hon. George W. Cook, republican congressman-at-large from Colorado, severely arraigned the administration for its course in prosecuting alleged infractions of the public land laws in Colorado.
