Judge Kennedy yesterday afternoon refused to issue the temporary injunction asked for by John W. Towle to prevent the directors of the Bankers Reserve Life company from changing the company from a mutual to a stock company. Blackburn, one of the defendants, and their attorney, defied a statement in open court that the defendants would not reinsure, all the risks of the mutual company or take any steps toward changing the mutual company to a stock company.
