Nut Loaf Recipe.

Crumble or cut stale bread, fine dry, without browning, in a warm oven. Stir occasionally. To three cups of crumbs add one teaspoonful salt, one-half teaspoonful black pepper, one-quarter teaspoonful cayenne, one-eighth teaspoonful saffron, one tablespoonful minced parsley, one pint of celery, one apple (chopped), melt one-third pound of butter and in it fry one medium sized onion. Pour this over the other ingredients. Beat three eggs. Add one pint of milk. Pour over the mixture. Let stand to soften. Chop fine three cups of nut meats (pecans, filberts and Brazils). Reserve one tablespoonful for sauce, and mix rest with crumbs. Mix well. Form in loaf. Bake one hour and a half in a buttered perforated tin, basting often with the butter, melted in hot water. Garnish with slices of oranges and parsley.
