CLERGY IN CIVIC AFFAIRS

Ministerial Union Will Share in Municipal Government.

WANTS BRIEF IN CLOSING CASE

Favors Carrying Sunday Observance Litigation to Supreme Court of the State for a Final Ruling.

A committee of seven on social service was appointed at the Omaha ministerial union meeting Monday morning, to look after ministerial affairs.

The committee appointed by the executive committee consists of Rev. B. F. Fellman, chairman; Rev. F. W. Leavitt, Rev. N. H. Bjorkick, Rev. M. L. Mellick, Rev. J. P. Roucher, Rev. D. R. Turnbull and Rev. H. J. Kirschstein.

In the matter of holding a big mission to be conducted by Dr. Chapman in 1908, the committee reported that it favored the plan but thought the ministerial union should not undertake the matter.

Superintendent Ritchie of the Anti-Saloon league asked for the support of the ministers in his work.

Philosophy of Prayer.

Considerable discussion arose over what was pronounced a learned dissertation on "The Philosophy of Prayer," by Rev. Frederick T. House, pastor of First Congregational church. "We must give up the idea of magic in the realm of faith," said Mr. House. "Faith and prayer and religious experience are as much subject to the laws of the infinite and are as regular and definite and orderly in their working as are mechanics and chemistry. Faith powers are as natural and eternal as the power of gravity, though for the present less understood. We must give up the opinion that certain faith powers were let out of heaven for a brief period about the days of the apostles and then withdrawn, like a return ball. Faith is a fact, eternal. Prayer must conform to law. When men frequently ask for it that two and two may not make four, it is said the ear of Russia is a devout man. He prays for a continuation of his autocratic power.
