Along with the statement of the banks that loans in Omaha exceed, by almost \$3,000,000, the figure of the December statement, comes the news that the east has returned to the west to place loans, and prefers the securities on real estate which are offered to the stocks and bonds offered in the east. An idea of the desirability of western loans may be gathered from the statement issued by the state of New Hampshire, which shows that fifty-two savings banks of that state have \$7,656,661 loaned in the west. A large part of it is in Nebraska and western Iowa. This is \$1,000,000 more than the holdings of New Hampshire savings banks last year and \$2,000,000 more than the amount held in 1902.
