JUDGE OBJECTS TO DELAY
W. H. Munger Shows Tardy Lawyers Technicality Won't Go.
MUST HAVE SOME REAL REASON
Former Senator Mason of Illinois, Attorney in Policy King Case, Asks for More Time to Prepare.

Judge W. H. Munger, seemed in fairly good health Monday morning and was not disposed to encourage delays for technical reasons in several of the land cases set for trial at the trial of the United States district court.

Jolt No. 1 came when the bonds of James H. Edmisten for \$3,000 each were declared forfeited because of Mr. Edmisten's failure to appear for trial. A second jolt was dealt when he announced that the bond of E. W. Allen would be forfeited unless Mr. Allen put in an appearance for trial by Thursday morning. This is also a land fraud case. Jolt No. 3 was given in the famous Chicago race case, wherein Lawrence E. King, Patrick J. "Polley" King and P. E. Baird were called upon to answer the summons of the court to appear for trial for trying to beat the government out of large tracts of land in Sheridan county.

Harry C. Broome, attorney for Baird, asked for a continuance of the case until April, as he was merely associate counsel for Patrick J. King, asked for a continuance in the case of his client for the reason that Senator "Billy" Mason of Illinois, who is the chief counsel in the case, could not be here for the April term, because of the primary elections in Illinois at that time and that he might not be able to come before August.

Judge Munger was of the opinion that the attorneys had been given ample notice. "The court wants more substantial reasons and not technical ones before any delay can be granted," said Judge Munger. "You should be ready. Why are you not ready? The court will give you until next Monday. By that time Senator Mason can

have arranged all the necessary preliminaries for his primaries.
The Babcock and Agnew land trials will go over until the April term, the attorneys for the defense furnishing "substantial" reasons for the delay.
It was decided to let the twenty-eight-hour cases go over until the April term. "There being nothing for the jury to do it was excused until 9:30 Tuesday morning."

CAPTAIN J. S. GARWOOD DEAD
Young Veteran of Spanish-American War Dies After Operation for Appendicitis.

Captain Jesse S. Garwood of the United States secret service department died in Wise Memorial hospital at 8:30 Monday morning from appendicitis. He suffered a severe cold a few weeks ago while working on some land cases up in the vicinity of Alliance. The sickness later merged into laryngitis. Appendicitis developed last Thursday and he was taken to the Wise Memorial hospital to be operated upon. The disease had gained too strong a hold upon him for permanent relief by the operation and death ensued Monday morning.
Captain Garwood was a veteran of the Spanish-American war, having been commissioned as a captain in the Forty-seventh United States volunteers. Upon the disbanding of the volunteer army, Captain Garwood was appointed to a similar position in the Philippine Constabulary and served there with Captain Wallace Taylor of Omaha, with whom he was closely intimate, but subsequently serving in another department of the islands. His health failed him through constant exposure there and he returned to the United States and after recuperating his health somewhat he was appointed to a responsible position in the secret service department of the government. He was engaged in the investigations of the Colorado land and timber frauds, and was working with Captain Joseph Walker at the time of his assassination near Durango, last fall. He was then called to Nebraska and has been working in this state since. He has been in Omaha about two months, and was regarded as one of the most efficient men in the service.
Captain Garwood was an Iowan, and is survived by his wife, who was at his bedside at the time of his death. His age was 34 years.

FIGHT ON PRINTING BILL
L. J. Quinby Questions Action of Board and Seeks to Enjoin Payment.
Payments of warrants amounting to almost \$5,000 to Klopp & Bartlett company for work done the county probably will be enjoined by an opposing printer, who asserts the job was wrongfully let by the county commissioner.
L. J. Quinby, a printer, and his attorney spent the forenoon in the county clerk's office Monday looking up the records in the case with the intention of starting suit to enjoin the payment of the money. The warrants cover supplies for the county comptroller, the county assessor and the district clerk, and they were ordered last month outside the regular contract and without advertising for new contracts. The matter came up during the factional fight in the county board. Bruning and Traylor asserting the supplies were ordered without authority by the three majority members of the board.
The other members of the board excused their action by saying all the supplies were in the nature of emergency supplies which were not covered by the regular contract. They claimed to have secured a few figures for the work.
The basis of the proposed injunction will be that the commissioners have no right to buy more than \$200 worth of supplies without advertising for bids.
