The social features will be the reception by President Roosevelt at the White House Wednesday and a reception at the Corcoran gallery of art Thursday evening.

At tonight's session an announcement will be made by Board of Education, secretary of the National Civic Federation, concerning the plan of that organization for sending American teachers to England and other European countries as a commission to inspect schools.

BULLET VICTIMS ARE SAFE

Brother and Sister Shot by Latter's Suitor Rest Well. NO GRAVE RESULTS ARE FEARED Council Bluffs Man Shoots Woman, Whose Brother Defends Her, and is Also Wounded in Return.

Mrs. Leslie Burns and her brother, James Donnelly, who were shot by W. Johnson of Council Bluffs, an unsuccessful suitor of Mrs. Burns, Monday night, are resting well at the home of Mr. Donnelly, 508 North Forty-fifth street, and will, in the opinion of Dr. F. A. Nelson, recover without serious results.

From the story told by Donnelly and Mrs. Burns, it appears that the shooting occurred in front of the residence of Sam Peterson, 459 Cuming street. Johnson was arrested on the charge of shooting to kill, while Mrs. Burns and Donnelly were removed to their residence nearby and attended by Dr. F. A. Nelson.

Hearing the shooting, Peterson and A. E. Bigs, who lives at Forty-fifth and Iard streets, came running to the scene and held Johnson until the arrival of the police.
