Cables Bring Disappointment and Reckon Heavily on Domestic. Selling is far more general. Lack of demand and values slump slightly—Wheat is easy on the weak foreign reports.

OMAHA, Feb. 25, 1930. The cables were disappointing and reflected heavily on the domestic market. There was a lack of demand and selling was more general, and values slumped slightly.

Wheat was easy on weak cables which came from London and other points. Selling became general when late cables continued lower and the advance was not maintained.

Corn receipts were 36,000 bu. and shipments were 31,000 bu. against receipts last year of 34,000 bu. and shipments of 32,000 bu.

Cleaner was 10,000 bushels of corn, 70,000 bushels. Liverpool closed 1/4 cent lower on wheat and 1/2 cent lower on corn.
