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FIGHT GROWS WARM IN IOWA

Second, Third and Fifth Districts Will Tell the Story.

STAND PAT FACTION MOST ACTIVE Every Possible Effort Being Made to Reconvert Ground Progressives Secured in Past—Shaw Still Hopeful.

(From a Staff Correspondent.) DES MOINES, March 2.—(Special.)—On the results of the county conventions in the Second, Third and Fifth congressional districts largely hangs the question of who will have the majority of the delegates to the congressional districts in the national convention.

But the various congressional districts select their own delegates, two from each congressional district. There is no doubt but that the standpatters will control the selection of the delegates from the Eighth, Ninth, Tenth and Eleventh. The Second, Third and Fifth are divided evenly.

In the Third district, if the progressives carry Wright, Franklin, Hardin, Butler and Black Hawk, they will have sixty-four delegates, and if the standpatters carry all the other counties they will have fifty-three.

Many Conventions Called. County conventions will come fast and furious during the next few days. The state convention will be held two weeks from Wednesday. The control of the state convention is the real thing that counts.

Recent indications that some of the standpatters are not for Taft for president is not causing much alarm with the progressives, who are sure of winning the state, in an interview recently said he was for Hughes. Laffoy in a signed statement in his paper recently said that his second choice was Hughes.
