Only One Announced Candidate for Delegate in First District.

LINCOLN, Neb., March 3.—(Special.)—The first district congressional convention will meet in Lincoln tomorrow afternoon to select two delegates and two alternates to the national republican convention.

Chairman Trogden of the congressional committee reached Lincoln this afternoon and other delegates are expected in tonight. So far there is only one announced candidate for delegate, Judge J. B. Stroud of Lancaster county, who is instructed by President Roosevelt.
