CAPTAIN AVOIDS FIRE PANIC

Three Hundred Fifty Passengers on Steamer Safely Transferred.

WIRELESS BRINGS AID TO BOAT

Steamer Vessel Called Out of Night to Lend Aid and Possible Disaster is Avoided with Ease.

NEW YORK, March 13.—Prompt and determined action on the part of Captain Appleby of the Fall River line steamer Providence prevented what otherwise might have been a serious catastrophe when fire broke out on board the craft while it was coming up Long Island sound bound from Providence for New York early today.

The call was promptly answered, the predicament of the Providence was explained, each steamer was advised of the other's position and they started toward each other. When they came together the fire was still in progress on the Providence, but the passengers, who had been aroused a few minutes before, had been told of the coming relief and were quietly waiting to be transferred to the other steamer.
