

GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

All Show Good Tone and Values Close with Fine Advance.

SHORTS COVER WHEN NERVOUS

Less Coverage at Firm and Higher Liverpool Cables—Wheat Starts Out of Firm and Trading in Slow.

OMAHA, March 14, 1908.

Grain markets all show good tone and values close with a good advance over yesterday. As a result of firm and higher Liverpool cables shorts became nervous and covered freely.

Wheat started firm but dull, with trading slow and little interest shown in the opening. Higher covered market and some bullish reports from the southwest gave bulls their start, prices advanced and some bull higher until the close. May wheat opened at 92c and closed at 91c.

The corn market was quiet and higher, with prices advancing from 56c to 57c yesterday a day. There was no corn offered on the floor and resistance from the bear faction was nominal and had little effect. May corn opened at 57c and closed at 56c.

Oats were firm, with values holding close to yesterday's figures. The market was dull and no change of an important nature was noted. May oats opened at 39c and closed at 38c.

Primary wheat receipts were 53,000 bushels and shipments 28,000 bushels, against receipts last year of 50,000 bushels and shipments of 38,000 bushels.

Corn receipts were 43,000 bushels and shipments 15,000 bushels, against receipts last year of 37,000 bushels and shipments of 12,000 bushels.

Clearance was 3,000 bushels of corn, 1,200 bushels of oats, and wheat and flour total to 25,000 bushels.

Liverpool closed higher on wheat and higher on corn.
