CROPS, CATTLE AND GAS GREAT

All Are Doing Fine in West, Says L. W. Wakeley. NEBRASKA IN THE FRONT RANK Reports from Southeastern Kansas Do Not Bring Such Good News of Crops Down There.

"The crop looks great, the cattle is fat, the ranges green, natural gas is discovered at Greylburg, Wyo., and the sand hills are one green carpet of crops," said L. W. Wakeley, general passenger agent of the Burlington, who returned Tuesday from a 2,300-mile trip over the Burlington lines west of the Missouri river.

"Natural gas has been discovered in northern Wyoming and this is the most interesting of the recent developments. Some parties there boring for oil struck gas. The volume is so great it is uncontrollable and all efforts to cap the well have been in vain.

HARLAN COUNTY WINS AT LAST

Comes Out Ahead in Ten Years of Litigation. STORY OF EZRA WHITNEY'S FALL

Lawsuit of Decade Involving Imprisonment of Public Official Settled by Federal Supreme Court. A law suit of ten years standing, involving the downfall of a county treasurer for embezzlement has just been decided on a mandate from the supreme court of the United States, wherein Harlan county wins out in the prolonged litigation by which the judgment of the United States circuit court for the district of Nebraska is affirmed.

Whitney Takes Appeal. An appeal was made by Whitney to the supreme court of the state and the supreme court affirmed the judgment of the lower court. Afterward execution was issued on the judgment and the sheriff of Harlan county levied upon the real estate of Whitney and it was sold to Harlan county, the sale being confirmed November 23, 1898.

Court Decides Not a Fine. The supreme court, however, decided that it was not a fine, but a judgment, and taking this view of the case, Judge W. H. Munger, November 29, 1905, in the United States circuit court, to which the case had been brought, held that it was not in violation of the fourteenth amendment nor of the statutes of Nebraska, nor of the constitution of the United States, and Judge Munger's order given on this date, November 29, 1905, was:

It is ordered, considered and adjudged that the plaintiff take nothing by his writ and defend his title in Harlan county to go hence and without day recover of the plaintiff (James Coffey), his costs and charges, and the interest thereon in this case as fixed at \$300.
