According to his figures, in the period from 1866 to 1896 the total mileage of the country increased 21 per cent, while the passenger business increased 93 per cent and the freight business 138 per cent.

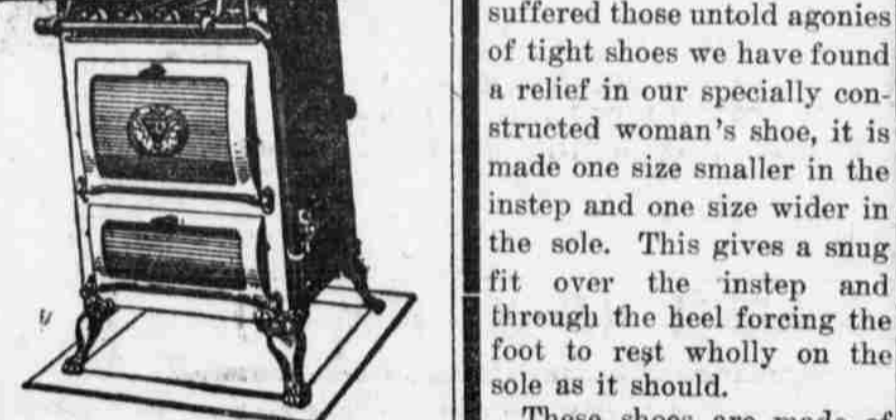
