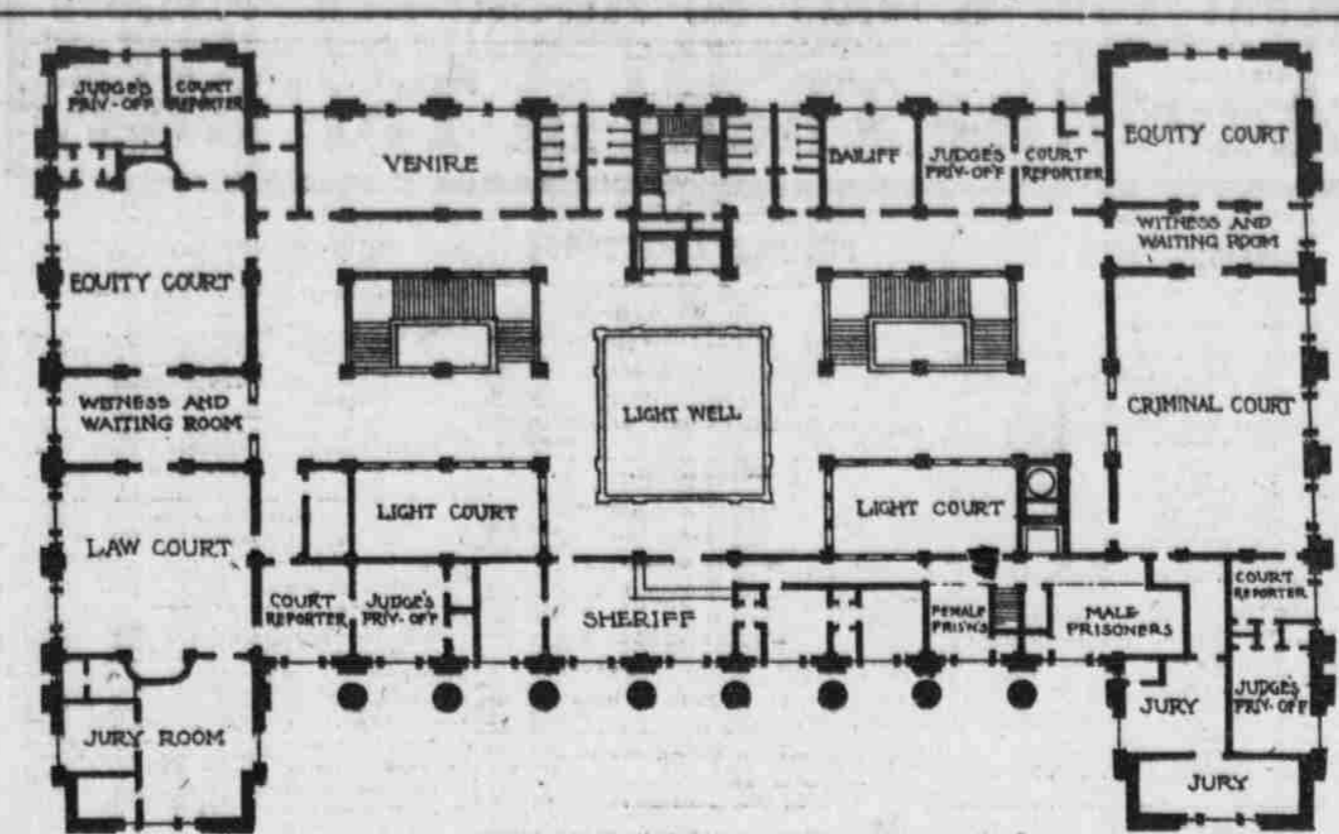

Schools AND Colleges

Projected additions to the public schools of Chicago involve an expenditure of \$8,000,000. Seats for 25,000 pupils will be provided.

Prof. L. E. Young, the new director of the School of Mines and Metallurgy of Missouri, is a graduate in mining engineering from the Pennsylvania State college. He has had a large experience in mining in Pennsylvania, Iowa, Michigan and Colorado.

Missouri State university at Columbia has been selected as the first American college in the rate of increase. Last year a bulletin investigating the growth of American universities was published by the American Council on Education...

A letter from Japan, published in Berlin, says that the study of the German language in Japan has fallen off in the last few years. At the close of the school term of 1907 in Tokyo the department of examinations reported that the following languages had been studied in the schools: English, Chinese and Russian...

The Massachusetts Institute of Technology, while it has only sixty-two foreign students, shows up well on the percentage basis. It is not unusual that a technological school of the type of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology should draw men from other countries as it has.

The South Americans who are found at Cornell are drawn there for engineering work in great part. That also helps to explain their presence at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology...

Yale and Columbia have not made very great advances in foreign population in the last two years, and as the universities both have grown in other ways the percentage has not changed markedly. Georgetown, although a small institution, has several foreign students and if it were permitted to count the preparatory department would be even higher up. Ten per cent of the 101 boys in the preparatory school are foreigners.

Syracuse of the class of institutions below the 3,000 mark has a fair number of foreigners, and even Brown with only seven students has a better percentage than some much greater places.

The cosmopolitanism of Cornell is well known among those who ever have taken the trouble to see for themselves whether it is so much a college for farmers. There are thirteen Filipinos and three Hawaiians at Cornell. The nearest to Canada may account for the presence of twenty-three Canadians at the Ithaca institution. There are fifteen Chinese, which compares favorably with California despite the nearness of the Berkeley university to the coast.

There are fourteen men from the Argentine republic, five from Brazil, five from Peru, two from Ecuador and one from Uruguay. Central America sends two from Costa Rica, one from Nicaragua and one from Guatemala. Incidentally there are nine Mexicans. Cornell has no less than ten men from India, which is unusual enough. These men from India and the twenty-three from Canada are the largest part of the delegation from British possessions.

There are three Australasians, three Englishmen and one from Ireland. Other European countries are represented fairly well. Russia has four students, Holland, Switzerland and Turkey two apiece, while Bulgaria, France, Germany, Norway and Sweden are represented by one apiece each.

There are six Japanese at Cornell, less perhaps than at many other colleges, notably Columbia. To top off with, Asiatic Turkey, South Africa and Palestine each claim one student in Cornell's 2,442.

Although the representation of foreign students is only a little more than 4 per cent of the total registration at the university, the cosmopolitanism of the foreign group is considered the vital fact. There are no colleges which can show men of so many different races and countries on their lists, although some colleges here and there may have more men from certain countries than Cornell.
