AFFAIRS AT SOUTH OMAHA

Council Indulges in Much Talk, but Accomplishes Little. HITCH IN PAVING CONTRACT

Finance Committee Reports Shortage in Number of Funds, but Council Takes No Action to Replenish Them.

Little business, but much advising and devising, characterized the special meeting of the city council last evening.

A resolution was passed awarding the paving of G street to Dan Hannon, he being the lowest responsible bidder.

A half dozen ordinances were recommended favorably by the judiciary committee. Among them was one declaring the necessity of the construction of a viaduct over West Q street.

The city treasurer was ordered to transfer the items accrued interest on the premium bonds from the sale of the Missouri avenue paving bonds.

Margaret Kennedy presented a claim for damages of \$1,500, due to the grading of Fifteenth street north of Missouri avenue.

The finance committee reported that the following regular funds of the city were short to the extent quoted: Public light, \$541.45; street repair, \$1,514.74; library, \$900; park, not known; police, \$146,509.
