CHICAGO, July 8.—Profit taking on a large scale caused a break of nearly 2 cents in the price of wheat teday. At the close the September delivery was down law 1%c. Corn was up %60%c. Oats showed a gain of 3%c. Provisions were 1601% higher.

The selling pressure in the wheat market was due chiefly to improved weather conditions in the United States and Canada for the new crop and to reports from the southwest regarding threshing returns. Many of these advances from the harvest fields of Kansas and Oklahoma stated that a larger yield was being harvested than had generally been expected. A decline of over 1d in the price of wheat at Liverpool tehded to increase the volume of liquidation, which was liberal at the start and to the finish. The market received little support from the bulls, the crincipal demand coming from shorts. The close was weak. September opened %614c lower at \$76000 km., compared with 417,000 bu, the corresponding day a year ago. Minneapolis, Duluth and Chicago reported receipts of 488 cars, against 385 cars last week and 244 cars a year ago.

The corn market was a triffe easier at the opening, because of lower cables, favorable weather for the growing crops and the slump in wheat. The market soon rallied on good demand by cash houses and continued atrong the remainder of the day. The close was strong. September opened %60%c lower at \$46,654%c, advanced to 55%c and closed at 56% 25%c. Local receipts were 157 cars, with 28 cars of contract grade.

Oats opened easier, but quickly rallied and held strong. Demand urgent all day and was brought out chiefly by the large number of reports which were received telling of the poor condition of the new crop. The close was strong. September opened %60%c lower at \$46,654%c, advanced to 55%c and closed at 50%co. Local receipts were 161 cars. Much smaller receipts of live hogs than had been expected induced moderate buying of provisions by local packers and caused a firm market. At the close September ports was up 17%c at 16.50. Lard
