N. P. Swanson Thinks it Will Pail Because the Swedish-Americans Could Not Adopt Old Country Ways.

probable effect of the new information bureau established in the United States by order of King Oscar of Sweden, whose purpose is to induce Swedes to return to sons stayed in Sweden after spending s

their native land. This hureau is of official character, although backed by private individuals in Sweden is experiencing the effect of the large emigration which has taken place in recent years and there is an unsatisfied demand for laborers, not only those in the trades, but for unskilled and agricultural labor. As a result of this condition an emigration investigation committee was formed at Stockholm and the government now requests Swedish newspapers in the United States and Swedish consuls and others to give the widest publighty to the work of the committee. It particularly desires to know the condition of the Swedes in America, what prompted them to leave their native land and their present family relations both in Sweden and the United States. The committee requests all Swedes to supply this informs tion, giving names and dates regarding themselves and to send this information to the Royal Swedish consulate, 17 State street, New York City, before October 1.

Return to the Native Land. The reported intention of the committee is to have as many Swedes who are no satisfied with their conditions in America return to their native land and resume their former allegiance,

Speaking of this desire and the request for information, N. P. Swanson, who has recently recurned from a trip to Sweden,

"I do not think any attempt to attract Swedes from America will succeed. Many of the immigrants came here when they were young and while they maintain the use of their native language, their customs are American and they can no more adapt themselves to Swedish ways than can any person foreign to the soil. The greatest cause for immigration is industrial. It is aimost impossible for people to secure land in Sweden. This land is held by owners of large estates and is not for sale. Tenants may prosper, even grow rich, but the knowledge that they cannot really own their home detracts from their practical loyalty to the country and they do not feel they are sacrificing as much in leaving their native land as they would if it were practically possible for them to own a portion of it. Conditions in Sweden are improving, but it will be many years before the country will be as attractive to wage earners or persons in moderate circumstances as in America.


