ASHEVILLE, N. C., July 22.—Federal Judge Pritchard today discharged Ticket Agents Wood and Wilson of the Southern railway or habeas corpus proceedings and declared the penalty clause of the new rate bill unconstitutional.

WOOD and Wilson were recently sentenced to thirty days on the chain gang for violation of the law. In his decision Judge Pritchard said the penalties inflicted by the statute would close the doors to a judicial hearing and would amount to \$2,500 a day if the penalty was enforced.
