ENGINEER SAYS IT IS GOOD

Condition of Number of Injured People in South Omaha Hospital is Pronounced Satisfactory.

The city council will meet at the city hall this morning at 10 o'clock to go with a party of citizens and a committee of the Good Government league to inspect the sewers, which are under construction.

The progress of the work on the Mud creek sewer has been quite satisfactory in all respects during the last two months. The work at the east end of the inside tunnel has been suspended for the present.

The break of the water main was caused by a leak, which caused the filled ground to slip away so that the weight of earth over the main broke it by the strain.

Condition of Injured. The condition of the wounded at the South Omaha hospital remains unchanged in most of the cases. The unidentified man is still unconscious, and it is possible that he may not recover.

British Exports Are Less.

WASHINGTON, March 20.—The first month of the present year has shown a decided decrease in Great Britain's exports and imports, according to Consul General Wynne at London, the imports were \$274,255,514, a decrease over the same month last year of \$20,288,214. The exports in January aggregated \$19,538,260, a decrease of \$3,255,710. The re-exports amounted to \$22,115,000, a decrease of \$10,677,427.
