Rev. Nathaniel McGiffen Assumes Pastorate of Love Avenue Church.

COMES WITH FAMILY TO OMAHA

Instructed by Zealous and Active Set of Workers—Has Good Record in Other Presbyterian Parishes.

Rev. Nathaniel McGiffen, the new pastor of Love Avenue Presbyterian church, Fort and Nicholas streets, will preach his first sermon as shepherd of his flock Sunday morning.

Mr. McGiffen succeeds Rev. A. S. C. Clark, D. D., who resigned the pulpit here to accept a call to the Second Presbyterian church of Evanston last November.

Since that time the pulpit has been supplied by other ministers. The church is in active working order and grows in its membership from a constant welcome.

Dr. McGiffen was born near Wheeling, W. Va., July 11, 1868. He received his early education in Canonsville seminary, N. Y., graduating in 1890.

He had his first church at New Haven, Conn.; was called from there to the church of North East, Pa., with a membership of 200.

His health failed and he came to Nebraska, accepting a call to the church of Holy Redeemer, Omaha, in 1908.

He found it with 100 members and left it with 250. He has been an ardent friend of Hastings college, which has conferred the degree of Doctor of Divinity upon him.

Mr. McGiffen's father and brother were distinguished military men. His father served in both the Mexican and civil wars and became a colonel.

He also held several public offices. His brother, as a student of current history, was engaged by the Chinese government before the outbreak of the Chinese-Japanese war.

Mr. McGiffen is considered one of the strongest Presbyterian preachers of the state.

He refused. He sailed for San Francisco and underwent surgical treatment for hernia.

He was the hand of a dying hero. And then China, believing its legendary custom had been vindicated, erected a tablet to the memory of the man.
