unreasonable restraint of trade. Whenever the period of filing had passed without any such prohibition, the contracts or combinations could be disapproved or forbidden only after notice and hearing with a reasonable provision for summary review on appeal by the courts.

Trade Agreements Encouraged. "It is important that we should encourage trade agreements between employer and employe where they are just and fair. A strike is a clumsy weapon for righting wrongs done to labor, and we should extend, so far as possible, the process of conciliation and arbitration as a substitute for strikes.

APPEAL TO THE PRESIDENT
Night Rider Outrages Said to Be Beyond State Control.
BUSINESS MEN SEND LETTER
Allegation that Situation is Growing Graver Every Day and that Grand Jurors Refuse to Do Their Duty.

LEXINGTON, Ky., March 25.—The failure on the part of the state authorities to bring down perpetrators of outrages committed by "night riders" culminates today in a direct appeal to the president of the United States, for federal interference in Kentucky, in the form of a petition prepared by leading men of Lexington and central Kentucky, which is being put into circulation throughout the nation.
