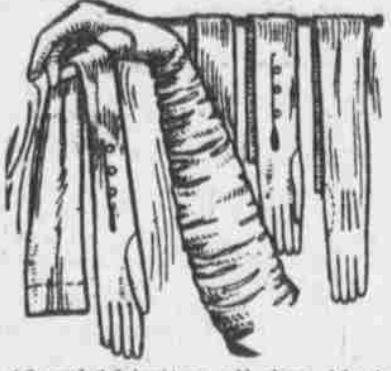

WOMAN WITH BOGUS MONEY

Charged with Twice Handling Same Bill Over Which Two Men Are in Trouble.

Mrs. Bojo Wlasiawojewich, who can talk English no better than an Englishman can pronounce her name, was found over by Commissioner Anderson in 498 for twice undertaking to get rid of a counterfeit \$10 bill.

She first passed the bogus paper on Frank Kuncel, a butcher at 1207 South Sixth street, some weeks ago. Kuncel discovered its worthless character and returned it to the woman and she made good the amount to the butcher. A few days ago she turned the bill over to Budi Savic and Dan Nimick, who undertook to pass it at the Brandeis store. Savic and Nimick were arrested by the federal and police authorities and indictments were returned against them for attempting to pass counterfeit money. They are now in jail.

It was through their arrest and indictment that the woman was discovered to be identified with, if not the principal figure in, the transaction. She was located and was arrested by Officer John Dunn and the United States secret officers and taken before United States Commissioner Anderson at 2 o'clock Friday afternoon.

Mrs. Wlasiawojewich cried when arraigned and bound over, leading many to believe her utter ignorance of the money led to her distress. It was one of those Georgia bank notes and it is believed the woman was a victim of circumstances.

As the grand jury has adjourned the unfortunate woman may have to remain in jail until next fall.
