PULP AND PAPER INQUIRY

Speaker Cannon Introduces Resolution for Special Investigation.

REVIEWS ENTIRE CONTROVERSY

Committee Instructed to Look Into Rise in Price, Supply of Raw Material, Effect of Tariff and Other Features.

WASHINGTON, April 21.—A definite step was taken today toward a solution of the wood pulp and newspaper cost question in the introduction by Speaker Cannon of a resolution for the appointment of a select committee to investigate and obtain all possible information as to the reasons for the increased prices of white paper to the end that needful legislation may be enacted.

The resolution, which was referred to the committee on rules, of which the speaker is chairman, empowers the committee to "sit in Washington or elsewhere" during session of the house and the recesses of congress and confer the usual authority of subpoena, the administration of oath, etc.

Following is the resolution: Whereas, It is alleged by the American Newspaper Publishers' association that the cost of paper to the users thereof is at least \$6,000,000 per annum greater at the present time than it was two years ago.

Whereas, It is alleged by others that the publishers, magazine publishers and printing managers will, under the price now asked, be \$2,000,000 greater for the current year than heretofore, and

Whereas, The American Newspaper Publishers' association that the statistics compiled by the bureau of the census concerning the cost and value of news print paper are erroneous, inaccurate, incomplete and valueless as a guide to legislation.
