HOLDS \$165,000 IN REAL ESTATE

When articles of incorporation were filed Saturday for the "Ralston Townsite company," with an authorized capital of \$350,000, the mystery of why Dr. George L. Some Beverages that May Be Easily Made and Served at Home. A Delicious Sherbet—One quart of milk, one pint of cream, two cups of sugar, white of eggs, juice of two lemons. Dissolve one of the cups of sugar in the quart of milk and the remaining cup of sugar with the lemon juice. Place the milk and sugar in an ice cream freezer and freeze to the consistency of thick cream. Add lemon juice and sugar and when this mixture is frozen nearly solid turn in the white of eggs beaten stiff. Freeze the whole until solid and pack with ice and salt and allow to stand for two hours before serving.
