PLANTER KILLS NIGHT RIDERS

Kentucky Tobacco Grower Fires on Men Who Were Scraping His Young Plants.

FRANKFORD, Ky., May 2.—The adjutant general was notified of an encounter between a prominent Madison county tobacco grower and a band of night riders, which took place a few nights ago, the details of which were recently suppressed.

Colonel F. W. Lillard, commanding the troops patrolling this part of the state, obtained information that two negroes were shot and killed and that a white man was badly wounded in an attack upon a tobacco grower's bed.

Half a dozen masked men called upon a farmer, who had refused to cut out the tobacco crop this year and demanded that he destroy the young plant bed. Upon his refusal they started to scrape the bed themselves, when he opened fire on them with a shotgun. Two negroes fell dead and an arm was shot off a white man, who is said to be a prominent citizen.
