

CONTRACTORS COMPLETE TUNNEL SECTION OF MUD CREEK SEWER.

WORKING ON OPEN SECTION NOW

Steam Shovel Will Be Used for Doing the Excavation on This Section—Grade School Track Meet Held Today.

The National Construction company has finished the tunnel section of the Mud Creek sewer and is busy removing the tracks from the interior of the tunnel and closing up the shaft at Fifteenth and Monroe streets from which men have been working for the last six months.

During the heavy rain last Tuesday a serious caving occurred at the east end of the tunnel section. All the shoring and timbering was washed out. The concrete was not injured, but the trench in which the sewer work is being done was filled and the work of opening it again will be a long and tedious process.
