Colored Citizens Respond Generously, Although Difficult to Separate Their Subscriptions From the General Total.

Omaha has again gone "over the top" in the Christmas drive for memberships in the Red Cross. The number enrolled is 85,000. A great showing. The purpose of the drive this year was not so much the raising of money, as the securing of members emphasizing the united strength of the people back of the movement. The Colored citizens again, as always, did their share. A conservative estimate would place the number of our memberships at about 2,000. It is, however, difficult to separate our subscriptions from the general total, because the great majority gave to the general solicitors instead of through the special committee as was done last year. The whole city was districted and combed by energetic canvassers, so that none was permitted to escape. Then, too, many gave where they are employed.
