Foote, Chicago, Ill., prominent as a labor leader; Logan Smith, Ft. Worth, Texas; Wm. Downey, Ottumwa, Iowa; Clayborne Dungee, East St. Louis, Ill.; George W. Dickerson, St. Louis, Mo.; N. H. Walker, Kansas City, Kan., and others.
