BALTIMORE, Md., Dec. 16 .- Although he was shot six times in four Delegates to the League of Nations days while resisting arrest on two occasions, the spirit of Climon Murrell is not broken, and physicians at where he is being treated, say he will recover. Conference Not to Press Resolution on Present Assembly, But Will Await More Opportune Time.

#### LEADER OF DELEGATION MAKES POSITION PLAIN

While Not Surrendering Belief That "Equality Should Be Assured to All Men, Irrespective of Nationality, Race and Religion," He Waives Issue Temporarily.

TENEVA, Dec. 16 .- Viscount Kiku-G jiro Ishii, head of the Japanese delegation at the league of nations meeting, announced that Japan will not press the resolution for racial equality at the present session of the league assembly.

Viscount Ishii addressed the assem-APPOINTS COMMISSION bly following a report on the work accomplished by the committee on organization which was read by A. J. Balfour.

"Japan had an opportunity when the league covenant was framed to declare her firm belief in equality before the law," said the Japanese statesman. "We believe that equality should be assured to all men, irrespective of nationality, race and religion.

"The Japanese government and people deeply regretted the original framers of the league covenant refused to accept the Japanese proposiand after a discussion of the general tion.
