E. Smith and Company, its heirs and assigns, that I am lawfully seized of said premises, that they are free from incumbrances and I do hereby covenant to Warrant and Defend said premises against the lawful claims of all persons

PROVIDED ALWAYS, And these presents are upon this condition: That, whereas, said William C. Williams executed and delivered to said M. E.
