Fifteen hundred years ago, says Wallas, ancient civilization was visibly falling in ruin. Today history is repeating itself.

"Alaric had just sacked Rome; Atilla was a boy of 17, dreaming of still worse disasters that he was to inflict upon the western world, and the vandais were pressing on toward gales, the week of February 11th. the destruction of civilization in North Africa," Wallas said in speaking of the year 423.

"All the structure of government on which the ancient world as organized by Rome had depended had come to an end. Roman law was no longer valid.
