ARTICLE XIV, CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Citizenship Rights Not to Be Abridged

1. All persons born or naturalized in the United States. and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of the United States and of the State wherein they reside. No state shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any state deprive any person of life, liberty, or prop-erty without due process of law, nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws.

Chapter Thirteen of the Revised Statutes of Nebraska, Civil Rights.

be entitled to a full and equal enjoyment of the accommodations, advan-

tages, facilities and privileges of inns, restaurants, public conveyances, barber shops, theatres and other places of amusement; subject only to the conditions and limitations established by law and applicable alike to every

Sec. 1. Civil rights of persons. All persons within this state shall

Sec. 2. Penalty for Violation of Preceding Section. Any person who

shall violate the foregoing section by denying to any person, except for
