#### **NEW YORK JEWELERS** TO QUIT MAIDEN LANE

#### District Has Been Home of Gem Business for 80 Years.

New York .- No more diamonds will be stolen from Maiden Lane by "gem bandits" after next spring. Police learned that no ambitious plots for fortunes in pearls, rubles, rhinestones or amethysts can be carried out then and there. Not that there won't be any robbers left to operate, but there won't be any gems to operate on.

The diamond district is moving uptown, Maiden Lane, for more than eighty years the home of the watch, diamond and jewelry trade, will become just plain Maiden Lane in a few months. Firms which have been established in this street for more than fifty years have made arrangements to move to a new center in Forty-seventh street.

There has been a gradual exodus from Malden Lane for some time, following the general trend northward of both wholesale and retail trade,

But there has been no concerted movement until the present one, arrangements for which have been perfected during the last year.

The pioneers among the dealers who moved up town settled on Fifth ave-Now the others virtually will take possession of Forty-seventh street from Fifth avenue to Sixth avenue. This will tend to concentrate the shopping centers of all types in one district, taking into account the northward movement of department stores as well as jewelers.
