


## GIVEN REWARD FOR OWN ARREST

### FRENCH HAVE TROUBLE IN WEST INDIES

Paris, France, Oct. 10 .- By the Associated Negro Press)-The re-election of M. Candace to the chamber of deputies from Guadelope is said to have precipitated a period of bombing, attempted assassinations, and general disorder, the trouble in the island being fomented by the sympathizers and adherents of the defeated candidate, M. B. Boisneuf, who has been thrown into jail. An appeal has been directed to the government here asking intervention. Guadelope and Martinique are the oldest colonies in possession of the French nation.
