The heavy rains the past week stopped shoe threshing for a while but it has made the corn crop a certainty.

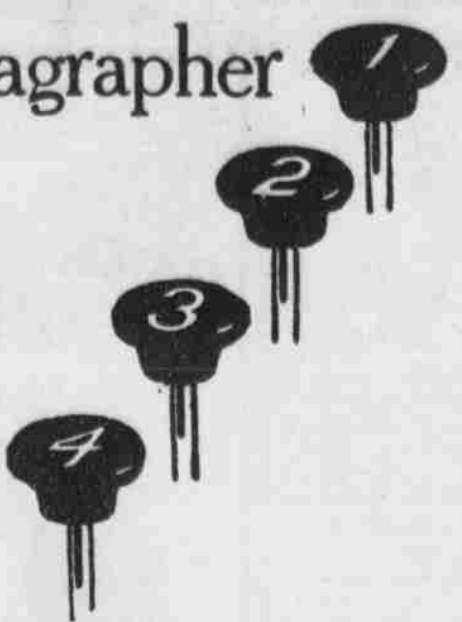
George A and Chas Blessing joined the crowd of excursionists last week that went to Colorado for an outing, and to look over the land situation.
