Olden Days in Covington.
Items reproduced in the Sioux City Journal from its files of twenty years ago:

March 27, 1891: Yesterday morning about 3 o'clock a light occurred in the white house at Covington, which resulted rather seriously to two of the participants, John Peyson and "Doc" Middleton. The latter received a pistol wound in the right side and the former had his skull fractured by a blow apparently administered with the butt of the revolver.

March 30, 1891: Since the Peyson shooting affray at the white house at Covington the town has taken on a comparatively moral streak. All the gambling houses were closed by the Dakota county officials soon after the shooting.
