H P Shumway was elected senator from this district by a majority of 1074. He carried every county in the district, four in number—Dixon, by 317; Dakota, 131; Thurston, 78; Burt, 492.

State Senator-elect H P Shumway, of Wakefield, was elected president of the board of education section of the State Teachers' association at Omaha last Friday, at the close of the state teachers' meeting.

The unofficial returns in the county election last week gave Stephen Joyce a small majority over Peter Carney for county assessor, but after the votes were canvassed the returns gave Carney a majority of 17 over Mr Joyce.

The total vote polled in Dakota county was 1514, divided as follows in the eight precincts: Dakota, 231; Hubbard, 182; St Johns, 140; Covington, 244; Omadi, 274; Pigeon Creek, 78; Summit, 120; Emerson, 145.
