

BUY 75,000 HORSES FOR WAR

No Danger of Shortage in This Country, Says Expert-Big Demand Later, However,

Warring European nations have bought and exported more than 75,000 horses from the United States, but there is no immediate danger that continued exports will cause an acute shortage of horses in this country, says G. A. Bell of the bureau of animal husbandry in the Agricultural

"We could sell two or three times the number already exported without ever, will be in a position to meet this there being any appreciable shortage of work horses," the statement adds. "The kind purchased are for the most part very mediocre animals, which would ordinarily sell for less than \$100 per head, and are a class of
