Dakota City, Neb., Nov. 27, 1916.
The board of county commissioners of Dakota county, Nebraska met in regular session. Members present: Thos. H. Long, chairman, A. Ira Davis, Oliver W. Fisher, Sidney T. Frum, county attorney, and Geo. Wilkins, county clerk.

When the following proceedings were had, to-wit:
