Notice is hereby given that there has been organized under and pursuant to the laws of the state of Nebraska, a corporation, the name of which is "Jackson State Bank."

The principal place of transacting the business of said corporation shall be at Jackson, Dakota County, Nebraska.

The object for which this corporation is formed is to carry on a commercial banking business under the laws of the State of Nebraska and the general nature of the business to be transacted is that of a commercial banking business.

The authorized capital stock of this corporation shall be \$25,000.00, of which at least \$15,000.00 shall have been paid in at the time of the commencement of business, which shall be issued in shares of the par value of \$100.00 each.

The affairs of this corporation shall be under the control and management of a Board of Directors consisting of at not less than three nor more than five share holders whose term of office shall be for a period of one year or until their successors are elected and qualified.

It shall be the duty of the Board of Directors to elect from their number a President and Secretary and to select a Vice-President and Cashier. They may also select an Assistant Cashier and such other clerks and assistants as the business of the corporation may require.

Until the regular meeting of the stockholders of the corporation shall be held on the second Monday of January of each year, the following named persons shall constitute the Board of Directors: Thos. J. Hartnett, John Ryan, Chas. J. Goodfellow, Rolt. E. Magrel and Hans Knudsen, and the following persons shall constitute the general officers of said corporation, namely: Thos. J. Hartnett, President, John Ryan, Vice-President, Chas. J. Goodfellow, Secretary and Chas. J. Goodfellow, Cashier.

An Ordinance Providing for the Appropriation of Money to be Raised by Levying a Tax on all Taxable Property in the Village of Dakota City, Nebraska, Said Money to be Raised to Defray Expenses of Said Village for the Fiscal Year Commencing April 30, 1918, and Ending April 29, 1919.

Be it Ordained by the Chairman and Board of Trustees of the Village of Dakota City, Nebraska:

Section 1. That the following amounts be appropriated for the use of the Village of Dakota City, Nebraska, for the fiscal year commencing on the 30th day of April, 1918, and ending on the 29th day of April, 1919:

Interest on water Bonds and sinking fund	\$ 700.00
Interest on Light Bonds and sinking fund	250.00
General Village Purposes	750.00

Section 2. That a tax be levied on all taxable property in the Village of Dakota City, Nebraska, sufficient to make said amounts, and that the amounts so levied be certified to the County Clerk of Dakota County, Nebraska, by the Village Clerk of Dakota City, Nebraska.
