Feeding Lambs in the Fall

The Animal Husbandry department of the University of Nebraska will is sue a bulletin soon on further experments in fall lamb feeding. Clip ping of lambs for fall feeding wa found unprofitable on account of the discrimination against such lambs on he market. Lambs receiving a full feed of corn were found to be made profitable than those receiving but a half feed, on a corn and alfaifa ra-tion. The use of the self-feeder con taining corn and oil meal in compari on with the heavy feed of corn sup alemented with alfalfa hay did no prove economical. Rape did no prove to be a satisfactory ration for fa thening lambs. Blue grass produced the most economical gains of any ration used. The cornfield feed ing of lambs gave a large daily gain reduced the cost of gain in comparion with the dry lot feeding of cor: and sifaifa, and increased the profit These lambs carried the most flesh or any lot in the experiment and sold of the highest value per 100 pounds Three lots of lambs fed green foed showed relatively high daily gains and at the same time, with the ex ception of the rape fed lambs, a very cheap gain and as a result a relative ly high net profit per head. The al-grass and cornfield lots showed to two highest profits of any lots.
