When fruit is added to a cake, it is usually floured to prevent it settling to the bottom. This is not necessary if it is added directly after the sugar, which is desirable in all dark cakes. If a light fruit cake is made, fruit added in this way discolors the loaf. The citron is first cut in thin slices, then in strips and then floured.
