Mr. Post came up from Carpenter Friday and is holding religious servicesat the church this week and will continue all week and over Sunday.


Yes, the third marriage we predicted some time ago has taken place, the contracting parties being Miss Mary Meek of Malinda and Con Bass of Montana.
