The Democrats in congress passed joint resolutions in caucus recently for the purpose of getting additional information concerning the Panama sittee were Senators Gorman, Culbertson, OMAHA, Carmack and Cockrell. The resolution CHICAGO, is as follows:

Resolved. That the president be requestcorrespondence and notes between the Department of State and the legation of the United States to Bogota and between either of these and the government of Colombia for the construction of an isthmian canal and all the correspondence and notes between the United States and any of its officials or representatives or the government of Panama concerning the separation of Panama from Colombia have been sent to the senate, and if not, that he be required to send to send the remaining correspondence and notes to the senate in executive session.

It is hoped that the lack of information that has been wanting in this matter will, be forthcoming. It has become a too prevailing habit withholding important information regarding public questions in which the general public is interested and has a right to receive information. The Panama question is most important and hence immediate attention.
