The infant child of Mr. and Mrs. Mike Shimek died Thursday last and was buried Friday in the Lawn cemetery.

Thomas Hughes of Denver was here to attend the funeral of his brother John whom he had not seen for fifteen years.

Miss Fannie Wilson of Alliance came up Saturday and remained over Sunday visiting her sister Miss Lucile Wilson.

Mr. and Mrs. A. S. Enyeart of South Table and Mr. and Mrs. Charley Lotspeich of Alliance, were in attendance at church services at this place Sunday morning.

Rev. Clark of Chadron preached at the M. E. church to a very small audience Sunday morning. However, there was a good attendance in the evening. The Reverend gentleman came to hold quarterly meeting but the people had forgotten it, and in consequence there was no communion service nor quarterly conference.

John S. Hughes, one of the first settlers of this valley died Friday evening of heart failure. He had been ailing for some time but was not known to be any worse than usual. He was born in Tyne, Wales, about 58 years ago and leaves a wife and three small children. Rev. Shall of Crawford Congregational church preached the funeral discourse and Mr. Cleland also of Crawford took charge of the funeral. Thomas Hughes of Denver and Mrs. Robert Thomas of near Mitchell, the only brother and sister residing in America was here to attend the funeral. Mrs. Hughes and her children have the sympathy of the entire community.

Sylvester Muldoon, who lived near this place for fifteen years but who sold out here and bought land on North Table near Hough and moved there about a year ago, shot himself through the head last Thursday and was dead when found. A coroner's jury was empanelled and the verdict was that he came to his death by a gun shot wound accidentally inflicted by his own hand. Mr. Muldoon was a very early riser and had been in the habit of taking his gun out to the barn with him to shoot at hawks and covies that were numerous at his place. He was found sitting against the side of the barn, gun in hand, and from appearances it is supposed that he sat down waiting the approach of some chicken devouring animal and while in this posture fell asleep and while so the gun was discharged. He leaves a wife and several children who have the sympathy of a large circle of friends. Much sickness and death has fallen to the lot of Mrs. Muldoon and this sudden and unexpected death of her husband seems to fall with crushing force upon her and is almost more than her frail being can endure.

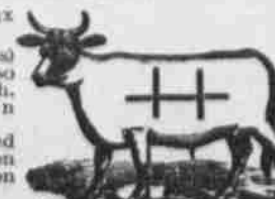
