

To the Patrons of the City Water Department of Alliance.

In view of the recent action taken by the city council looking to such improve-ment of the water supply as will obviate

whatever seeming justification that may have been in the past for the unauthorized using of water for sprinkling lawns etc. I deem it well to call your attention to the following sections of the city ordinances. and ask that you assist in consuming what water supply we have by refraining from the use of water improper hours and the use of lawn hose without the regulative nozzle or sprinkler.

nozzle of sprinkler.

Be it ordained by the mayor and council of the City of Alliance, Nebraska, as follows:
Section 1. That the rules, regulations and water rates hereinafter named shall be considered as part of the contract with every person, company or corporation who is supplied with water through the water works of the city, and every such person, company of carporation by taking water shall be considered and held to consent to be bound thereby; and when any of them are violated, or such others as the said city commissioner may hereafter adopt, the water shall be cut off from the building or place of such violation, even though two or more parties may receive water through the same pipe, and shall not be let on again except by order of the water commissioner, and on payment of the expenses of shuting it off and turning it on, and upon such other terms as the said commissioner shall determine and a satisfactory understanding with the party, that no further cause for complaint shall arise; and in case of violation the water commissioner shall have the right to declare any payment made for the water by the person committing such violation, to be forfeited, and the same thereupon shall be forfeited.

Sec. 2. Said section 2 of said ordinance

If allowed to run at other hours, the water will be cut at without previous notice, and it must be confined to a fair application for those purposes, without excessive and unreasonable use, and in the premises of the party. In sprinkand to the premises of the party. In sprink-ling streets each consumer must confine them-selves to one-half of the width of the street. The hours above named shall not apply to those using meters who may use water at any

time.
Sec. 45. Any person being convicted of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fided in any sum not less than One Dollar, nor more than One Hundred Dollars, and shall pay the costs of prosecution and stand committed to the county jail until such fises and costs are paid.

By direction of city council, in future the provisions of the forgoing ordinances will be enforced in all cases that come to the knowledge of the undersigned, either by personal observation or reliable information otherwise obtained. This is not a threat but the plain duty of your water AHLE HILL.
