

'THE ALASKAN' AT GRAND

Closing Week of Popular Playhouse Began Yesterday Afternoon.

 "The Alaskan," the tuneful and picturesque musical comedy which began the Grand's season last summer, is the closing bill this week. The entertaining story of the far Northwest has lost none of its power to please during its year's absence and large audiences yesterday laughed and applauded throughout the performances. With two such rollicking comedians as Gus Weisberg and Richard F. Carroll to carry the burden of the wholesome nonsense with which the piece is replete; there is no dearth of laughter and with such a charming Arlie Easton as Jessie Stoner, the pretty lyrics which fall to this role are most pleasingly sung. Miss Etta Lockhart is a dainty little Ku Ku, and the Atwater of Al Rauh and the familiar Totem Pole Pete of Detmar Poppen, who has already been seen in the part here, add materially to the cast. Mr. Rauh is an excellent tenor and Mr. Poppen has a fine bass voice which is heard to special advantage in the big "totem pole" number. He is also a good actor.

The Eskimo ballet is composed of the prettiest young women who have been seen in its small ranks for a long time and the roystering snowball number proved the big hit of the performance, as it usually does, though Miss Stoner's "Mother Did" was a close second for popularity. Miss Alice Keen is specially good as Mrs. Good-Better-Best.

Richard F. Carroll has the unctuous, burlesque role of Walsingham Watt, the nifty operatic manager, and he gets about all the fun out of the part that has been placed therein. Gus Weisberg gives one of his inimitable German dialect performances as Professor Knickelbein. The piece has undergone considerable tinkering at the hands of the two comedians and the humor has been brought down to the minute. Carroll and Weisberg are a team that would carry almost any piece that was capable of being carried by anybody. For a warm weather entertainer this breezy and refreshing pot pourri of melody and wholesome nonsense of the frigid zone is particularly recommendable. It will be the bill for the week.


