A Growing School

The annual year book of St. Agnes Academy has been issued for 1910, and shows a marked increase in attendance for the second year of its existence over the first. The total enrollment for the school year of 1909-10 was 205, divided as follows: day pupils, 123; boarders, 82.

The capacity of the academy building having about been reached and the prospects being good for a still larger attendance the coming year, a contract has been let to S. C. Reck for the construction of a three story and basement addition, forty-eight by one hundred ten feet, the same to be erected of brick on the north side of the present building. The same when completed, will cost, including plumbing, heating, etc., about \$30,000, and will about double the present capacity. The new building is to be completed in time for the opening of the fall term of school, which will be Sept. 6th, as the following academic calendar for the next school year shows:
